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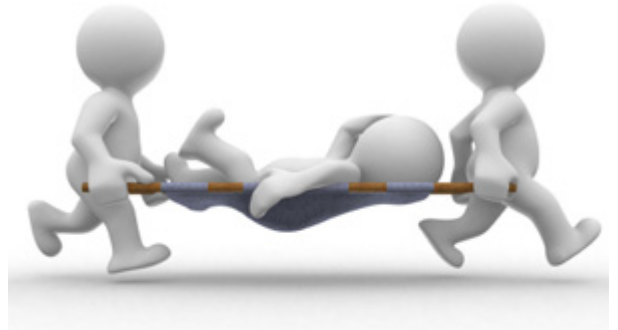
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## **Emergency First Aid in the Workplace for the Appointed Person**

### **Course Description**

An in house programme of contact training for those who wish to gain knowledge of emergency procedures and attain a recognised HSE qualification in First Aid.



### **Course Aims**

By the end of the course, candidates will be able to demonstrate the essential knowledge and skills needs with threatening emergencies in the workplace.

### **The Appointed Person**

Where an employer's assessment for the First aid needs identifies that a 4 day FAW qualification is not necessary, the minimum requirement is to appoint a person to take charge of First Aid arrangements. This includes looking after the equipment and facilities' and calling emergency services when required.

Note: Appointed Persons are not First Aiders and should not attempt to give First aid for which they have not been trained.
